# WILDFIRE PREVENTION AND RISK REDUCTION IN NORTH SAANICH \*\*UPDATED - April 2019\*\*

Members of the Dean Park Estates Community Association (DPECA), North Saanich Residents Association (NSRA), and Property Responsibility on the Waterfront (PROW) have teamed up to advocate for and support wildfire prevention and risk reduction in the District of North Saanich.

In 2018, DPECA, NSRA and PROW prepared a "Call for Action" document on wildfire prevention in North Saanich. In 2017, a Fire Hazard Rating sign was posted by the North Saanich Fire Department near John Dean Provincial Park (corner of Dean Park Road and Carmanah Terrace).

• North Saanich Fire Prevention Bylaw. No open burning is allowed anywhere in the Dean Park area with the exception of outdoor appliances. If it is an "outdoor appliance", you must consult the North Saanich Fire Department first as a permit and inspection is required. The above process aids North Saanich Fire Department staff or the after hours Duty Officer to respond immediately to your questions and concerns.
